WASTE MANAGEMENT SITE

Following a letter from Clean Farms the transfer sites in Marwayne, Paradise Valley and Vermilion will not accept Rinsed Farm Chemical Containers after Dec 31st, 2024.

Clean Farms guidelines request that your container be returned to your retailer in the future.

Your containers will need to be bagged prior to disposal, bags will be available at your retailer or at the transfer stations while supplies last.

So, look before you toss them, they are in cellphones, toys, rechargeable tools, solar lights just to name a few. The transfer station has a safe collection site for those batteries, please bring them in for safe disposal to prevent hazards to the entire operations.
